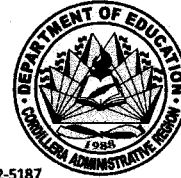

All the symbols combined represent unity and harmony of its people with culture and environment in beating the gong for self-determination.




